Over 455,000 Students are transported in school buses everyday
 School buses travel over 100 million miles per year

PROBLEM IDENTIFIED

Vehicles are unlawfully passing school buses as students enter and exit.





Scanning



Speed, Aggressive driving and Failure to stop (passing) school buses remains a serious problem. Every violation represents a potential accident and potential injury to a student.

2013 Survey


85,279 instances of passing Nationwide
 1,523 passing violations in Washington State alone*
 * Of 288 Districts 110 reported

Even more disturbing, of those 1,523 violations 32 instances of cars passing buses on the right - the side on which students enter the bus


