

#### Nightowl - Vehicle Crime 2000 - June 2004 Inclusive





• ALO – Architectural Liaison Officer - The Architectural Liaison Officer works with the Local Authority Planning Departments, developers and architects to sell the principles of 'Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design' (CPTED). In simple terms, it aims to stop the building of places criminals thrive on, i.e. design out crime features.





- MSA Motorway Service Area These exist along the majority of our 3 lane highways, known as motorways, in the UK. They are essentially rest areas providing hotels, restaurants, gasoline, parking etc...
- BCU Basic Command Unit This in effect is a local policing area. Within Staffordshire we have 4 BCU's, ours being known as Chase BCU.





• ANPR – Automatic Number Plate Reader – Developed as a policing tool alongside our Police National Computer. The system has the ability to capture a tag, we call it a registration number, on a vehicle and instantaneously deliver on screen intelligence info on that vehicle gathered from a variety of sources. It can be used at fixed or portable sites.





- In this instance it was used as a stand alone system by the company on their own database made available to police agencies re evidence gathering and investigation.
- Secure Car Park Scheme this is a government approved accreditation available from UK police forces to operators of car parks who bring their premises up to a required set security standard.
