#### Blackburn with Darwen



- Industrial heritage
- Diverse population, including 22 % of Pakistani/Indian heritage, many also from Eastern Europe
- 60,000 households, 17% owned by social landlords
- 17/354 most deprived Borough in England
- 31% under 19 years old


## Why bother working with anti- social families?

Improve the quality of life of:

- The Family (children and adults)
- The Community (sense of safety, house prices, creation of 'no go' zones)
- Reducing costs to other agencies e.g. Police, Environmental, Welfare, Landlords, Churches
- Prevent moving the problem on to the next community!



## Anti-social behaviour issues identified in families



## Family Characteristics

- 39% of children in families at 'very high /medium' risk of being taken into care
- 50% of children 'frequent' non attendees at school (30% experienced school exclusion)
- 28% of children had learning difficulties
   (18% with ADHD)
- 19% of parents with depression
- 17% with child drug/alcohol problems



## The Family Intervention Project Model

- Whole Family Approach
- Intensive support from Key Worker(10 hrs/week)
- Persistent and Assertive style
- Challenge and Support Combination
- Contract of work both family and agencies
- As long as it takes

## Simpson Family

## The problems

- Complaints to police and landlords
- Undesirable visitors to the property
- Noise nuisance
- Drunkenness/late night parties
- Visitors urinating outside of the property
- Child Protection Concerns including child crime!



### The support contract

- Motivation to change?
- Knowing the sanctions?
- Addressing the issues
- Writing the contract:
  - > Strategies to enable Miss Simpson to turn away visitors
  - > Addressing alcohol issues
  - Multi-agency working
  - > Child Protection
  - > Relationships



## **ተለተተተተተተተተተተተተ**

#### What we did...

- 6 weekly multi-agency meetings
- CCTV, front door lock installed
- Referral to women's centre
- Referral to Community Alcohol Team
- Access to nursery provision
- 1:1 parenting sessions
- 1:1 family sessions

#### Involvement

- 18 months intervention
- Intense support (up to 10 hours per week)
- Reviews held every 6 weeks



#### Outcome

- The children are no longer subject of a Child Protection Plan
- There is no longer a risk of eviction no ASB!
- The Police make regular visits to ensure Miss Simpson is 'ok'
- Miss Simpson is no longer misusing alcohol
- New, positive, relationship
- The Family Intervention Project have now closed the case.



## Response

## Fantastic Outputs!

- Since 2003, 260 families referred to the Family Intervention Project, (197 met criteria for program)
- 41 of the 197 were on verge of being evicted (only 5 needed to be evicted by end of intervention)
- These 197 families represented 809 individuals, including 550 children/teens

## Significant Changes!

Perception that ASB a problem	2003	2006	2008
Teenagers Hanging Around	66%	62%	53%
Rubbish & Litter	63%	54%	48%
Drug Taking & Dealing	71%	52%	43%
Vandalism, Graffiti, Damage	63%	40%	37%
Drunk & Rowdy Behaviour	52%	33%	33%
Noisy Neighbours	27%	18%	19%

#### Fantastic Outcomes!

#### Between September 2007 and 2008:

- The proportion of families with poor parenting, domestic violence and child protection issues was halved
- The proportion of families reporting education/ learning problems (e.g. truancy, exclusion, bad behavior at school), was reduced from 72% to 45%

## Developments since 2007

- Parenting work, including...
  - Parenting Experts
  - Delivery of Evidenced Based Programmes
- Dispersed service
- Youth Crime Action Plan FIP
- Secondments: Police, Housing, Domestic Violence and Drugs Service

## September 2009 Gordon Brown (Prime Minister) states...

- By 2015 around 50,000 families, over 100,000 children and communities will benefit from the support of a FIP
- Predicted saving as a result of this investment could be as much as 400 million a year.
