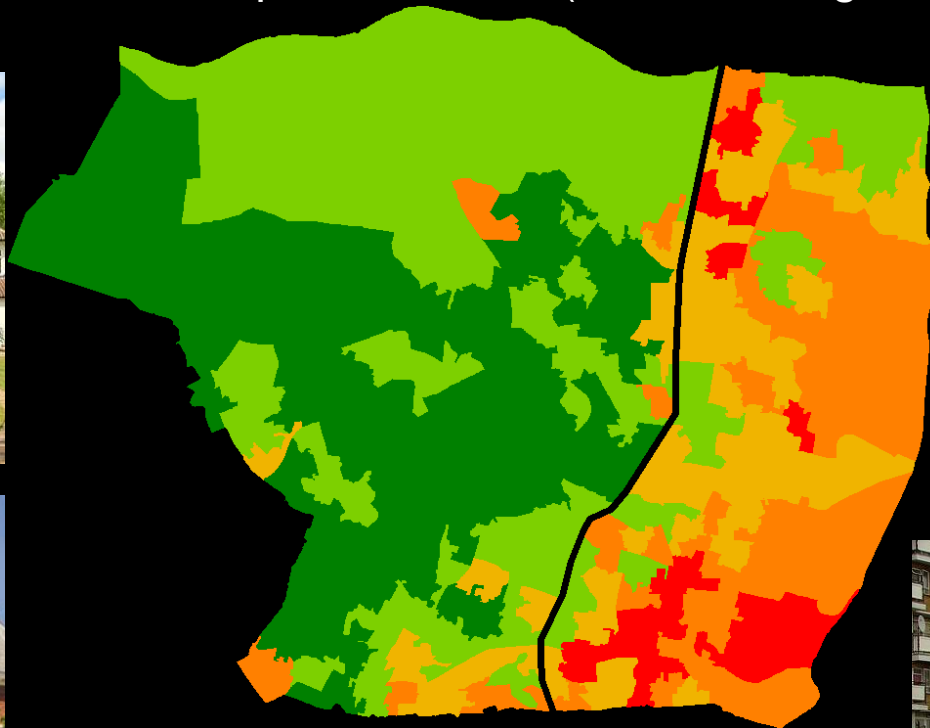

Man critical after street battle

TWO young men were stabbed during a mass brawl in Edmonton.

The fight, which broke out in Hertford Road, at 7am on Sunday, involved more than 20 men and teenagers armed with knives and baseball bats.

One man, aged 22, is in a critical condition in hospital after being stabbed in the chest.

A 17-year-old was also stabbed but was discharged from the Royal London Hospital later the same day.

Police cordoned off the area in Edmonton, including parts of King Edward's Road, Bridlington Road, and Hertford Road, throughout Sunday. Several shops, including the post office and a Texaco garage, have remained closed since the fight.

Investigating officers have found baseball bats, pieces of wood and bricks

believed to have been used during the skirmish, but none of the knives used has yet been traced.

Nearby shop workers believe that rival gangs could have been leaving a late-night party when the fight broke out.

Two men were arrested at the scene, and another three people were arrested later on Sunday on suspicion of violent disorder. A 19-year-old woman was also arrested on suspicion of assisting an offender.

All have been bailed until mid-December pending further enquiries.

Acting Detective Inspector Rob Murray, of Edmonton CID, said: "This was a serious incident and our enquiries at this stage are focused on trying to gather as much information as possible.

"We would ask any witnesses or anyone else who can help to contact us as soon as possible."

A ROAD rage attacker has been jailed after leaving a man needing 60 stitches to his face. Huseyin Aksu, of Church Street, Edmonton, slashed a man several times in the face in Stoke Newington in October 2006 when the victim was helping his brother park a car. Aksu was sentenced at Snaresbrook Crown Court to a minimum of three years and nine months, and will then have to prove he poses no threat to society. He will remain on licence for life.

Gangsters jailed

'Edmonton and Tottenham, this war just carries on'

FEUDING gang members from Tottenham and Edmonton have been jailed for their role in a bloody street battle sparked by a row in a nightclub.

The two rounds of sentencing took place at Wood Green Crown Court, in Lordship Lane, on Monday and Tuesday.

It was the final chapter in a complex investigation and trial owing to the huge amount of people involved and the hostility between the two groups who live in neighbouring wards.

The violent clash took place in Edmonton at around 7am on Sunday, November 11, 2007, following a "long and bitter enmity" between NPK, whose members all live in Northumberland Park, Tottenham, and the Edmonton Shankstarz, named after the street word for knife, shank.

Prosecutor Quinn Hawkins told the court that earlier on the morning of the clash, NPK associate Yanick Mayavova, 21, was attacked with a champagne bottle at Club 19 in Forest Gate, east London, by members of the Edmonton gang.

The plan was to ambush the Shankstarz members when they returned.

This fuelled NPK to plot a revenge attack, he said.

The court heard that a three-car convoy of NPK associates drove to a house in Edmonton where Aidan

The plan was to ambush the Shankstarz members when they returned.

But the Tottenham gang was spotted by lookouts and the two crews ended up in a violent clash

with wood, bricks, metal poles and knives in and around Hertford Road.

Aidan and Liam Palmer claimed their grandparents' house had been attacked by bricks on two occa-

Liam Palmer, 19, was handed an eight-year prison term when he was sentenced on Friday, May 15, 2008.

He pleaded guilty to violent disorder and was also found guilty of wounding with intent and conspiracy to commit violent disorder.

In an interview with police, Aidan Palmer, 22, said: "What it boils down to is Edmonton and Tottenham. This war just carries on."

He added that he was not involved "this time" and said it was his younger brother's generation involved in the violence.

On Tuesday Judge Witold Pawlak handed NPK members Jermaine Lewis-Barnes, 21, Mikel Dixon, 19, Nathan Mason, 24, Tion Miller, 19, and Richie Nkundo, 19, sentences of 22 months each, for conspiracy to commit violent disorder.

Miller was given an additional four months for attacking one of the Shankstarz as the verdicts were read out.

Rodney Brew, 19, was given 300 hours of community service, a two-year supervision order and a curfew.

The court heard how the three NPK members — Dixon, Lewis-Barnes and Brew — were ambushed while sitting in Lewis-Barnes' silver Renault Megane, which would not start.

Up to 15 members of the Edmonton gang battered its windows with wooden bats

Youth crime expert visits

A CRIMINOLOGIST will visit Wood Green this weekend to talk about the rising gang culture in London.

Youth crime expert Professor John Pitts has produced several reports about gangs within the UK. It is believed up to 170 gangs exist in London.

The professor, based at the University of Bedfordshire, will join ex-gang members, the faith community and the Metropolitan Police at the Bite the Bullet conference to be held at Westbury Avenue Baptist Church, in Westbury Avenue, this Saturday.

Professor Pitts said faith leaders could play a vital role in getting young people to turn their back on gangs.

He said: "Church members are local, they are often connected with the young people and families experiencing these problems, they have made a personal commitment to helping and they are likely to be around for much longer than the professionals. Continuity is very important."

The conference will end with a music showcase featuring urban gospel artists.

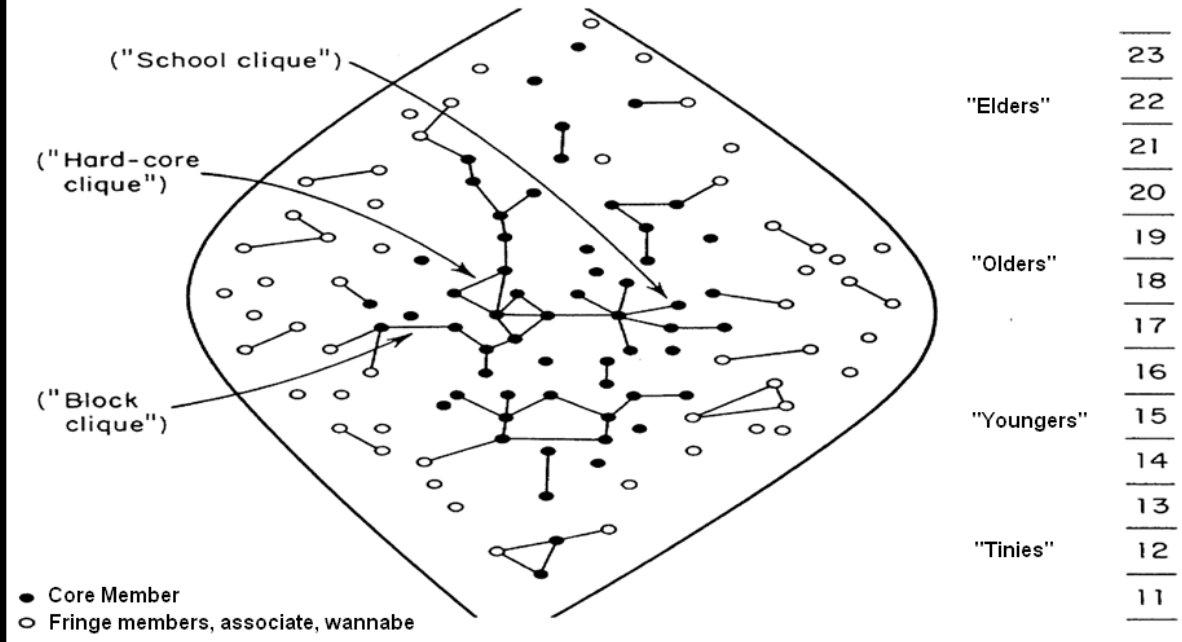

GANG MEMBER IS HIT BY NEW LAW

A TEENAGE thug who has terrorised the streets of Edmonton has been banned from the area and all of neighbouring Haringey after being shipped with north London's first gang injunction.

Dylan Martin, 19, from Edmonton, has also been banned from entering Enfield and from making violence on the internet, as well as making references to other gangs including the Mob, NPK, Dem African, Young Dem African and YCI.

Martin, who has convictions for a string of offences including assault and possession of offensive weapons such as knives and stolen firearms, was hit with the injunction at a hearing at Edmonton County Court. He was also identified as a member of several gangs, including Chum Gang, Shurlock, YDA and Camp.

Injunctions against gangs were introduced in January, and are similar to Aylesbury that target gang-related violence rather than anti-social behaviour. Other gang injunctions have been issued in Hackney and Southwark.

Andrew Clouse, head of community safety at Enfield Council, said the move was a victory for decent residents. "This is great news and fantastic work by the council and police," he said. "While gangs operate all over London, this injunction sends a strong message to so-called gangsters that the council will do everything it can to break them up and keep our streets safe for decent residents and families."

"If anyone sees Dylan hanging around in those areas or sees signs of him on the internet making violence they should contact the police immediately and we will push for him to be sent for rehabilitation behind bars."

Enfield borough commander, Chief Superintendent Drew Tucker, added "We will look for any opportunity to tackle gang activity with a view to reducing incidents of serious youth violence in Enfield. We are using all of our powers to make the borough as safe as possible."

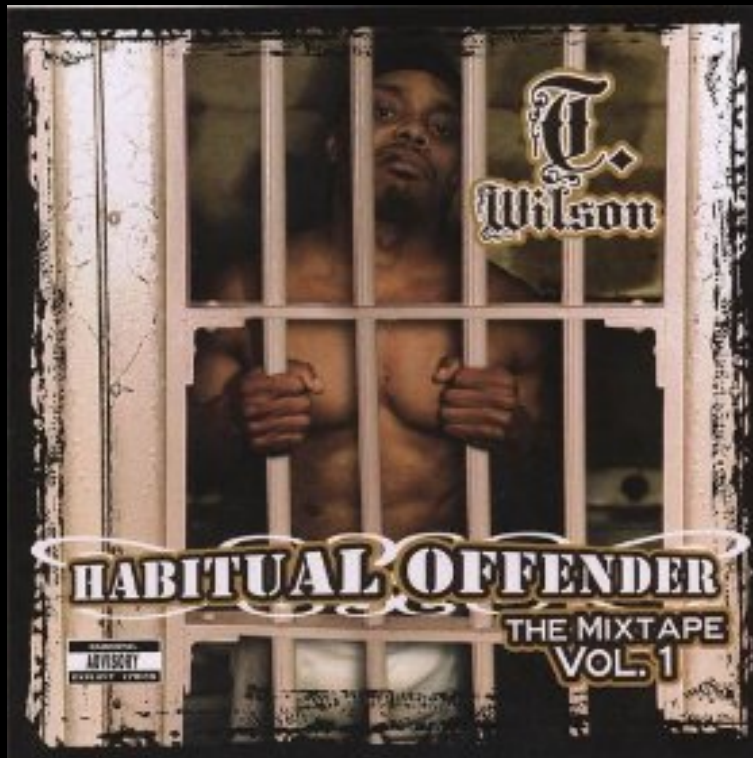

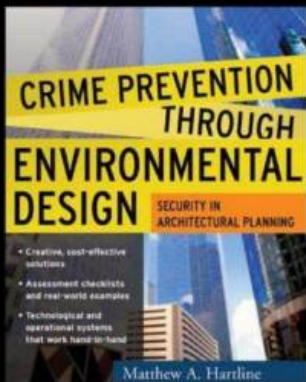

Notable successes

- Two significant individuals were supported into full time further education at a local college
- Supported re-housing of significant individual out of his gang neighbourhood (now in gainful employment)
- In a rare case, a gang member broke the 'No Snitching' rule to provide evidence against his attackers resulting in a custodial sentence.

 - “Police Generated” ↑ 276.0% (drugs / weapon possession)
 - Proportionate increase from 18% to 36%
 - 6 Gang Homicides in 2007-08
 - 1 Gang Homicide in last three years
