Conclusion

Resources & budgets focus on top end offenders
Successes could lead to cost saving /improved
life chances

Little academic data, similar 'Scared Straight'
Custody Office underused potential cost effective resource

- 20% reduction target set









- On target to achieve bigger reduction than 2011
- Justifies CGAs resource investment







Qualitative

- All 120 completed questionnaire
- 45% stated they felt 'scared' or 'terrible'
- 20% stated they 'didn't like it'
- 10% answered 'not bothered'
- Four percent did not answer the questions
 Most importantly
- 88% stated the Custody Experience had:
 'definitely made them think about their behaviour'





Cost saving

- 2009 184 reprimands = \$597,000
- 2011 123 reprimands = \$398,000

Savings = \$199,000


